<b>Course Objective</b>	This intensive online course aims to develop students' understanding of SDGs by bringing together inspirational speakers and educators from diverse disciplinary backgrounds, who share their experiences and views in addressing local and global sustainability challenges. Through lectures and discussions, students will gain a coherent and situated understanding of SDGs framework, its global local implications as well as needs for action.
