### Course code, English title and Chinese title

**Course Code:** CLCC1703  
**Title in English:** Elementary Cantonese for Chinese Speakers  
**Title in Chinese:** 華語學生粵語初級

### Course description

This is a foundation course on Cantonese which introduces Cantonese romanization systems to students. Course contents include basic daily conversations, vowels and tone exercises and pronunciation practice. This course will enable learners to engage in simple real-life conversations by using Cantonese.

### Learning outcomes

Students are expected to:  
 (PO2: for levels 3-4) participate in simple conversations on predictable topics, obtain information by asking and answering questions, combine learned materials to communicate personal meanings, satisfy basic personal needs and social demands.

### Grade Descriptors:

Grade A / Excellent: Outstanding performance on all learning outcomes.

Demonstrates the ability to synthesize and apply the principles or skills learned in the course in a manner that would surpass the normal expectations at this level and typical of standards that may be common at higher levels of study. The 'A' grade should be reserved for truly excellent work that exceeds the level expected for the majority of students.

Grade A- / Very good: Generally outstanding performance on all or almost all learning outcomes.

Demonstrates the ability to synthesize and apply the principles or skills learned in the course in a manner that would fully fulfil the normal expectations at this level and occasionally reach standards that may be common at higher levels of study.

Grade B / Good: Substantial performance on all learning outcomes, or high performance on some learning outcomes which compensates for slightly less satisfactory performance on others, resulting in overall substantial performance.

Demonstrates the ability to apply the principles or skills learned in the course in a comprehensive manner that would sufficiently fulfil the normal expectations at this level.

Grade C / Fair: Satisfactory performance on the majority of learning outcomes.

Demonstrates the ability to partially apply the principles or skills learned in the course in a manner that would meet the basic requirement at this level.

Grade D / Pass: Barely satisfactory performance on a number of learning outcomes.

Demonstrates the ability to partially apply the principles or skills learned in the course at a basic level on some assessments, while providing only minimal responses or possibly tangential content in others.

Grade F / Failure: Unsatisfactory performance on a number of learning outcomes, or failure to meet specified requirements.

Unable to demonstrate the ability to apply the principles or skills learned in the course, providing irrelevant or incomprehensible responses on most assessments.
